2018 - 2019 Wisconsin PEPSI USBC Youth Championships REGIONAL/STATE RULES AND FORMAT

U8 & U10 Certification #04528 - U12, U15, U17 & U20 Certification #04529

1. The Pepsi USBC Youth Championships is a certified scratch tournament governed by USBC rules.

2. One time entry. If an individual qualified and cannot participate in regional competition, replacement must be made at regional level. However, no replacement will be allowed at the state level. Competition is open to all 2018-2019 USBC Youth Division Certified members. To participate, bowlers must be bowling in a USBC certified youth league and not be under suspension at the time of qualifying.

3. League level competition is a benefit of USBC membership and has no entry fee. Bowling centers having 2018-2019 certified USBC youth programs are automatic league level qualifying sites.

4. Regional and state level competitions may only be held in BPAA/BCAW member centers that have an active BPAA Pepsi agreement.

5. Competition will be conducted in **twelve divisions** based on the participant's birth date. Participation in the wrong age division may lead to automatic disqualification. There are boys and girls divisions in each of the following age groups:

- U 8 - B/D 8/1/10 or later
- U10- B/D 8/1/08 thru 7/31/10
- U12- B/D 8/1/06 thru 7/31/08
- U15- B/D 8/1/03 thru 7/31/06
- U17 - B/D 8/1/01 thru 7/31/03
- U20- B/D 8/1/98 thru 7/31/01

All advancers to the Junior Gold Championships must be Junior Gold program members or be eligible and purchase a membership prior to the championships.

6. **Qualifying** Each center may run two - 2 week qualifying periods with the first round running between October 27, 2018 and November 17, 2018 and the second round running between December 29, 2018 and January 19, 2019.

7. **Ties to determine position standing** If there is a tie for the last place qualifier in a division, both will advance to the next level of competition, where applicable. At the state finals ties for first place only will be broken by a one game roll-off. Should a tie still exist, it will be broken by an additional ninth and tenth frame roll-off. (Refer to Rule 326a.)

8. **Closing date** for the first round entries to be received at the BCAW office is December 11, 2018. Closing date for the second round entries to be received at the BCAW office is February 4, 2019. Names, addresses and telephone numbers of regional qualifiers must be submitted to the tournament manager listed on the front of the entry form. **No additional entries will be accepted by the BCAW office after February 11, 2019.**

9. **Regional competition** will take place March 23, 24, 30 and 31, 2019 at various locations throughout the state. State competition for U12, U15, U17 and U20 girls divisions will take place at Village Lanes in Monona and U12, U15, U17

and U20 boys divisions will take place at Prairie Lanes in Sun Prairie on Saturday, May 11, 2019.

10. Qualifying scores must be bowled during regularly scheduled league play. Pre-bowled or post-bowled scores are not allowed to be used as scores for advancement purposes. Advancement to the next competition level will be from the league level.

11. Participants can advance only once to qualify in any region/state where they hold a 2018-2019 USBC Youth membership card.

12. In the event a bowler qualifies in more than one league in the same division, the bowler must advance from the league in which the highest series was bowled. For identical qualifying scores, the member will advance from the league where the first score was bowled.

13. If a bowler advances from league level in more than one region/state, the bowler must declare one region/state to continue competing before the next competition level.

14. Participation in any level of competition past the league level in more than one region/state will result in automatic disqualification. (Advancers remain in the division they qualified in during the league level in all subsequent competition. If there is a tie for the last place qualifier in a division, both will advance to the next level of competition.)

*Expense fee includes scholarships and the cost for state finals. Advancing bowlers do not pay an additional fee.

Entry fee checks are to be made payable to your center or coach. There may be a service fee for any returned checks.

15. All divisions advance from league level to regionals - advancing ratio 1:3 with a three game format or major fraction thereof, including last place ties. In all cases at least one bowler per division shall advance. Only the U12, U15, U17 & U20 boys and girls divisions advance from regionals to state - based on a ratio 1:10 with a six game format competition at state.

All bowlers advancing to the state finals will bowl two three game blocks to determine standings. There is no carry over from the regional competition to the state finals. Awards and Scholarship fees shall be returned 100%.

16. The top one bowler in the U12, U15, U17 and U20 divisions for boys and girls at the state competition with the highest score will earn a berth to the Junior Gold Championships.

2018-2019 USBC Junior Gold membership is open to all USBC Standard Youth members at the local level of qualifying for the Pepsi USBC Youth Championships. The 2019 Junior Gold Championships will be held July 13-20, 2019 in Detroit, MI. Bowlers must be USBC Junior Gold members to advance to the Junior Gold Championships. Bowlers without a current Junior Gold membership must purchase a Junior Gold membership prior to June 8. USBC will waive the \$200 (U20), \$200 (U17), \$150 (U15) and \$100 (U12) entry fee for these athletes. These athletes will compete for additional scholarships available to all athletes at the championships, as well as other prizes and awards. All U.S. citizens are vying for a spot on USBC Junior Team USA 2020 to represent the United States in national and international competition. If the U12, U15, U17 and U20 division champion is unwilling to become a Junior Gold member they will not advance to the Junior Gold Championships. However, the athlete will still retain the state scholarship, but the berth to the Junior Gold Championships will be awarded to the next eligible athlete. BCAW will pay a \$300 travel reimbursement. In order to receive travel reimbursement the bowler must compete in the Junior Gold Championships and submit appropriate receipts. No travel reimbursement or stipend will be provided by USBC for these athletes.

17. Finalists must agree to bowl in the Junior Gold Championships or in failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. Finalists who earn Junior Gold spots, but choose not to advance to the Junior Gold Championships are eligible to receive the scholarships they win, but forfeit any travel reimbursement provided by the BCAW. Replacements will be selected based on the order of finish in their division at the state level.

18. Failure to abide by any rules and regulations will lead to disqualification from this event. The Pepsi USBC Youth Championships tournament manager reserves the right to accept or reject any participant.

19. The Pepsi USBC Youth Championships Tournament manager will decide all matters not covered by these rules and regulations or USBC rules and regulations.

20. Dress code for regional and state competition. Neat appearance in both clothing and personal grooming is required by all competitors. All bowlers must wear suitable attire which will include polo shirts or sleeved t-shirts that must not contain any reference to alcohol, tobacco, drugs or profanity. (*Clean, neat clothing, no hats, shorts or skirts.*)

All bowlers are required to wear full-length slacks/pants in black, tan or denim during tournament competition. All clothing must be loose fitting. Clothes with tears and holes will not be allowed. No exposed undergarments or midriffs will be allowed. Please dress properly, as the Tournament Director has the final authority in determining the appropriateness of bowler's attire. Hats/caps cannot be worn during practice or while competing. This dress code is required as you are representatives of our sport. This rule will be strictly enforced at the 2019 Wisconsin Pepsi USBC State Championships.

21. Photographs of participants may be taken for publicity purposes.

22. No smoking, alcohol, chewing tobacco or foul language will be permitted in the bowling area.

23. No headphones, cell phones, or I-Pods will be allowed during competition.

24. Substitutes are permitted at the regional level competition ONLY. Substitutes must be within the same division and from the center that qualification took place. NO substitutes are permitted at state finals. Replacements may be used for bowlers not present 30 minutes prior to squad time as stated in Rule 2. Bowlers will be allowed ten minutes of practice time on their starting pair. A bowler arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame then being bowled. Frames missed count as zero. A bowler not present and ready to bowl when it is their turn will be credited with a zero for that frame.

25. Only bowlers and tournament officials shall be permitted in the settee and bowlers' area.

26. Symbolic awards will be given at the regional and state level distributed at a minimum ratio of 1:10 or a majority thereof.

27. Scholarships will be awarded to the U12, U15, U17 & U20 boys and girls division winners at the state finals. One scholarship will be awarded in each region to the U8 and U10 boys and girls division champion. All scholarships will be sent to SMART for administration.

28. Claims for errors in scoring or general playing rules must be made to the tournament manager within 15 minutes of completion of bowling. Questionable errors shall be decided upon by the tournament manager. All other protests must be confirmed in writing to the tournament manager within 72 hours or before the awards are given out. Each protest under this rule must be specific. Please call if you need clarification of the above rules.
